"I liked it. It was super fun. He's very nice. The speeches and poems were very interesting. If you listen, you'll like it. The club made me feel calm." - **Uson**


ARGUMENTATIVE ESSAY: WHY WE SHOULD HAVE MORE PHONE TIME


So that's why we think we would have more phone time. We could move phone
